Economic Equity & Business Incentives

- South Fulton Discount Visa Card for residents to earn and save while shopping locally
 or at select national chains
- **Down Payment Fund**: city-backed assistance for small businesses
- Tool Rental Library & Fix-It Popups: partner with Home Depot to reduce maintenance costs for residents
- Delivery Platform Fee (\$0.50/order): funds food access, delivery subsidies, and supports local restaurants

A Housing for All

- Launch **income-based housing** with no credit checks using fintech tools (Plaid)
- \$5,000 grants for down payments earned via verified community service hours
- Partner with 200 homes and 6 apartment complexes for pilot access housing zones
- Tighten inspection codes and enforcement to raise home construction quality

Smart Infrastructure: Trails, Easements, & Green Mobility

- Convert underutilized utility easements beneath power lines into connected greenbelt trails
 - o Trails will include shaded paths, benches, and fitness stations

- Tie-in to the Atlanta BeltLine through right-of-way design and funding coordination
- Work with Georgia Power and Greystone to trade reduced franchise fees for easement trail upgrades
- Beautify and activate Camp Creek Trail corridor with creek-fed green spaces, waterway enhancement, and small business hut rentals
- Lease city-owned property for high-revenue non-tax uses (franchise utility zones, trail sponsorships, pop-up commerce)

Digital City & Smart Services

- South Fulton SmartGov App: 24/7 access to city services, volunteer credits, digital bill pay, and discount card system
- Free public records with ID.gov, Clear, or Al verification unlimited for citizens, fee-based for attorneys or external firms
- Launch a Resident Financial Justice Unit to analyze CFPB complaint data and pursue action against bad actors

👺 Food Access & Cloud Kitchens

- Establish a city-owned cloud kitchen to support food entrepreneurs, delivery-only businesses, and address food desert issues
- Convert public buildings or underutilized rec center wings for culinary rental space
- Provide sponsored delivery credits for low-income residents



🔀 F³ – Fulton Futbol Festival

- South Fulton's official response to the 2026 FIFA World Cup
- Host tournaments, cultural programming, and build legacy infrastructure:
 - Mini-pitch fields via GA 100 program
 - o Pop-up viewing zones, global cuisine vendors, entertainment stages
 - o Tournament with \$1,000+ prize, sponsor booths, and youth soccer day
- Leave behind permanent branded assets: mini-pitches, branded yearly F³ Summer Series

Recreation & Cultural Economy

- Rebrand all rec centers as "The Leadership" transforming them into innovation hubs
 - o Install **audio/visual studios** for content creators and podcast rental
 - Launch pop-up kitchen and barbershop stalls, with extended hours until 10PM
 - Incorporate mini food courts in larger rec spaces with 3 micro-business food rentals
- Host city-backed creator incubators using city spaces to support art, digital media, and youth economy

👮 Public Safety & Justice

- Audit jail records and create oversight across both city and Fulton County law enforcement agencies
- Pass ordinance for a city-run jail facility that is modern, humane, and focused on reducing recidivism

- Create in-jail business programs (laundry, food packaging, repair) tied to post-release employment contracts
- Allocate 30%+ of all post-conviction asset forfeiture to youth programs, trauma services, and prevention grants

Health & Wellness Access

- Acquire land near the new Grady South Fulton Emergency Center
- Partner with Morehouse School of Medicine to open a satellite medical education + doctor office complex
- Launch South Fulton health corridor with clinics and preventive care options
- Offer **group insurance partnerships** for residents city-endorsed auto, health, renters, and legal protection bundles

🚛 Transportation & Industrial Planning

- Resolve 18-wheeler congestion by extending freight rail from Fulton Industrial to South Fulton in partnership with Union City
- Improve ride-share and delivery infrastructure: designated lanes, zoning for small depots, bus shelters
- Prioritize multi-modal green mobility in easement trail planning
- Lease underused land in industrial zones for solar, broadband, or franchise utility revenue



- Volunteer Neighborhood Leadership Program: city-trained ambassadors will visit every neighborhood 2x per year
- Pass legislation to demand USPS officially label all eligible areas as "South Fulton" not "Atlanta"
- Host **insurance hearings** to investigate rate hikes and denial patterns
- Create a South Fulton Resident Investment Trust: citizens receive dividends from city enterprise profits
- Add a \$3 opt-in self-tax that supports down payments for housing and youth programs

Year 1:

- Begin easement trail pilot with utility provider
- Rec rebrand launch + A/V studios open
- Mini-pitch sites finalized, F³ promo campaign begins
- Public insurance audit hearings + Smart kitchen selection

Year 2+:

- Launch Resident Trust program
- Break ground on city-run jail facility
- Cloud kitchen opens, BeltLine trail linkage constructed
- Morehouse South Fulton Health Campus planning and design
